### *Notes From the Nurse for Registration*

**Mandatory Requirements for attendance 2020-2021 School year: Forms due prior to the first day of school!!!**

**Kindergarten-** Blood Lead Level, Up to Date Vaccine Certificate, Certificate of Dental Screening completed by a dental provider or medical provider. Vision Screening completed by an eye care provider or medical provider.

**3rd Grade-** Vision Screening Form or Green Vision Screening Card. This can be completed by an eye care professional or medical provider.

**7th Grade-** Proof of TDAP Vaccine and MCV04 (Meningitis Vaccine). IDPH will not be allowing a grace period for this requirement. If not submitted by the first day of school the student will be sent home and not allowed to attend school until this is completed. Due to the coronavirus there will not be a vaccine clinic held at the school.

**9th Grade-** Certificate of Dental Screening. This can be completed by a dental provider or medical provider.

**12th Grade-** Proof of TDAP Vaccine and MCV04 (meningitis vaccine - must have proof of one after the age of 16). IDPH will not be allowing a grace period for this requirement. If not submitted by the first day of school the student will be sent home and not allowed to attend school until this is completed. Due to the coronavirus there will not be a vaccine clinic held at the school.

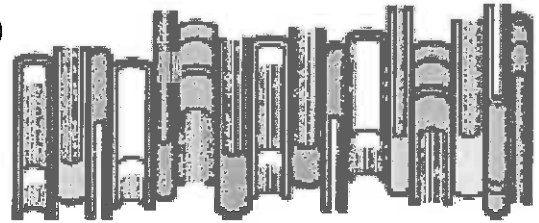

**STATEWIDE SMOKING BAN**

*Beginning July 1, 2008, after Governor Culver signed the Smoke Free Air Act (H.F. 2212), smoking is banned on all school grounds, including personal vehicles. Fines for individuals found in violation of the Smoke Free Air Act are currently set at \$50 per violation. **Parents'/Guardians' Rights Notification**

Parents/Guardians in the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District have the right to learn about the following qualifications of their child's teacher: state licensure requirements for the grade level and content areas taught, the current licensing status of your child's teacher, and baccalaureate/graduate certification/degree. You may also request the qualifications of an instructional paraprofessional who serves your student in a Title I program or if your school operates a school-wide Title I program. Parents/Guardians may request this information from the Office of the Superintendent by calling 319-726-3541, or sending a letter of request to Office of the Superintendent, Louisa-Muscatine CSD, 14478 170th St., Letts, Iowa, 52754. The Louisa-Muscatine Community School District ensures that parents will be notified in writing if their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not considered highly qualified.

Dear Elementary Families-

Welcome to the 2020-2021 School Year! We have missed seeing your children and look forward to a great year of learning together. This year, as probably expected, we will have quite a few changes in how we operate to help minimize the spread of germs. Although we can never be 100% that we will be protected, we are going to do our best.



As it gets closer to school starting I will be sharing some new guidance for the elementary school with how we plan to alter some of our day to day procedures. This includes how we drop off children in the morning, bus routines, pick up at the end of the day, etc.

This year school will be starting a bit earlier, August 17. We will not be having a Back to School Night as the school tends to be extremely crowded during this event. We recognize that one positive aspect of Back to School Night was being able to bring in school supplies. Please feel free to send the main items on their first day (notebooks, pencils, crayons, etc.) and send the others the following (such as Kleenex donations). We don't want kids tipping over with such heavy backpacks!! As a reminder, we have donated supplies for families in need.

We know that there are many procedural differences this year. We have planned a couple of days where only half of the children will attend. This will make social distancing easier as we learn the new routines. In effort to provide all of the needed components we plan to have the schedule for the first week of school as follows:

K-6 Students:

Monday, August 17 - No School for all students.

Teachers will be providing Google Meet/Zoom Meet and Greets sessions. The week of August 10th your child's homeroom teacher will be contacting you to share the times available. If you have concerns that you feel you need to talk to your child's teacher individually, that day will be available for an electronic meeting, or in person if needed by appointment. Know that we will have very limited time appointments after 4:00, so if there is any way you can make arrangements during the day it would be greatly appreciated.

Tuesday, August 18- Children with last names starting with A-L will be attending school all day (which as a reminder is a 1:25 dismissal).

Wednesday, August 19- Children with last names starting with M-Z will be attending school all day (which as a reminder is a 1:25 dismissal).

Thursday, August 20- All K-6 elementary students will attend school (1:25 dismissal)

Friday, August 21- All K-6 elementary students will attend school (1:25 dismissal)

Preschool Students:

Monday, August 17 and Tuesday, August 18

No school for students. Parent(s)/Student/Teacher Meetings will be held at the school. (Formally home visits). These are required by the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Grant. If at all possible we ask that the parent and preschool child attend without other family members. This is to reduce the number of people in the building as well as possibly reduce the amount of cleaning in the classrooms.

Wednesday, August 19- No school for preschool students (A reminder that Preschool will be attending regularly on M, T, TH, and F this year.)

Thursday, August 20- 3 year old students: AM Class only (Class time 8:25-11:25)  
4 year old students: Children with last names starting with A-L will be attending school all day (which as a reminder is a 1:25 dismissal).

Friday, August 21- 3 year old students: PM Class only (Class time 8:25-11:25)  
4 year old students: Children with last names starting with M-Z will be attending school all day (which as a reminder is a 1:25 dismissal).

All Preschool-Grade 6 Students will be attending beginning August 24. It is our hope that we have the procedures and schedules covered so that we are ready to dive into 100% learning.

We are looking forward to an awesome year learning together. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding as we make changes to keep the children and staff as safe as we can while learning together.

### EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

### OPEN ENROLLMENT DEADLINES

***Pursuant to the laws that govern open enrollment, applications filed after the March 1, 2020 or the 2020-2021 school year will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause". "Good cause" means a change in the status of a child's resident district for any of the reasons listed below. The deadline for kindergarten students is September 1, 2020.***

- \*Family moved to a new district of residence*
- \*Change in the marital status of the student's parents*
- \*Placement of the student into foster care resulting in new resident district*
- \*Adoption resulting in new resident district*
- \*Participation in a foreign exchange program*
- \*Participation in a substance abuse or mental health treatment program resulting in new resident district*
- \*Failure of negotiations for reorganization or rejection of proposed reorganization plan*
- \*Failure of negotiations for whole grade sharing or rejection of whole grade sharing*
- \*Loss of accreditation or revocation of a charter school contract*
- \*Severe health and/or pervasive harassment (If the application is being made in response to an alleged severe health need or pervasive harassment of student, the RESIDENT district will notify the applicant of status. The ap-*

## ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

\*\*The Louisa-Muscatine Community School District maintains records on each student in order to facilitate the instruction, guidance and educational progress of the student. The records contain information about the student and his or her education and may include, but not limited to, the following types of records: identification data, attendance data, record of achievement, family background data, aptitude tests, educational and vocational plan, honors and activities, discipline data, objective counselor or teacher ratings and observations and external agency reports.

\*\*The Records of each student are generally located in the school, which he or she is attending. Any exception will be noted in the students other records or by the person in charge of record maintenance of student records for each school building listed below:

- Louisa-Muscatine High School: Chris Parkhurst, Principal
- Louisa-Muscatine Junior High: Chris Parkhurst, Principal
- Louisa-Muscatine Elementary: Doug McBride, Principal

\*\*The following persons, agencies and organizations may have restricted access to student records without prior written consent of the parent or student over the age of 18 years. Any other access to student records shall be only upon written consent or upon court order or legally issued subpoena.

- A. School officials, teachers and Mississippi Bend Area Education Agency personnel with legitimate educational interests.
- B. Officials of other schools in which the student proposes to enroll.
- C. Representatives of state and local government when auditing and evaluating Federal educational programs.
- D. Officials connected with a student's educational financial aid application.
- E. Government officials to whom information is to be reported under state law adopted prior to November 19, 1974.
- F. Organizations that process and evaluate standardized tests.
- G. Accrediting organizations for accrediting purposes.

H. Parents of dependent children, regardless of child's age.

I. Appropriate parties in a health or safety emergency.

### **Student Directory Information:**

\*\*The Principal or person in charge of each attendance center may release the following types of information to the public, where appropriate, keeping in mind the privacy of the student and the student's family and the totality of the surrounding circumstances: name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, e-mail address, grade level, enrollment status, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, photograph and other likeness, and other similar information. Examples of releases are: military recruitment, articles published in the newspaper, etc. To prevent the public release of such information, a parent must file a written objection with the aforementioned person responsible for maintaining student records by August 31st. The objections need to be renewed annually. Students and parents may file with the Department of Education, complaints concerning alleged failures of the school district to comply with federal legislation dealing with student records. Correspondence should be addressed to: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office, Department of Education, Switzer Building, 330 C Street S.W., Washington, D.C. 20201

\*\*If you are the parent or legal guardian of a student you have the right to (1) inspect and review your child's educational records; (2) ask for an explanation of any item in the records; (3) have copies made at a reasonable cost; (4) be informed of types and locations of records being collected or used by the agency; (5) ask for the amendment of any record if you feel it is inaccurate, misleading or violates privacy rights; (6) a records hearing if the agency does not make the requested amendment; (7) give or withhold consent to disclose your child's records; (8) be told to whom information has been disclosed.

## Abuse of Students by District Personnel

↪ It is the policy of the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District that school employees and volunteers not commit acts of physical or sexual abuse, including inappropriate and intentional sexual behavior, towards students.

↪ It is the policy of the district to respond to allegations of abuse by school employees or volunteers by investigating or arranging for the full investigations of any allegations, and to do so in a reasonable prudent manner.

## CONCUSSION INFORMATION

Participation in school athletic activities provides opportunities for students to get daily exercise, increase lung capacity, and develop healthy habits. That opportunity, though, does not come without a potential risk of injury. Louisa-Muscatine coaches and trainers do everything in their power to prevent accidents from happening. Unfortunately, they are called accidents for a reason; we cannot prevent every injury. A new Iowa law that went into effect July 1st mandates schools to give information to all

7th-12th grade families regarding the risk and signs of concussions when participating in extracurricular athletic activities. That information sheet requires athlete's and parent's signatures acknowledging receipt of the information on an annual basis. Athletes cannot practice or tryout until that form is completed. Forms can be downloaded from the district website, obtained at individual sport parent meetings, or completed at registration. Thanks for your help in keeping our athletes safe and informed.

SCHOOL WELLNESS POLICY



As obesity has become a problem in youth and adults throughout the nation, we have seen increased concern with nutrition. To address this concern a committee of parents, community members, teaching staff representatives, nutrition staff, and administration worked to develop a wellness policy in 2006. In 2014, the committee worked to revise and update the policy which was approved by the Board of Education in June. The committee's goals have remained the same: to provide students with better nutritional



choices, not to become the food police, and give the students better nutrition information to help them make better food choices. Beverages and snacks in vending machines operated during the school day, as well as foods offered in the ala carte line, will follow nutrition guidelines provided by the Healthy Kids Act. Listed is a suggested snack list for parents sending treats to school. **STATEMENT REGARDING THE HOMELESS**


The Board of Directors of the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District is responsible for locating and identifying homeless children and youth who are "identified" within the district. A "homeless child or youth of school age" is defined as one between the ages of 5 and 21 who lacks a fixed, regular and adequate night time residence and includes a child or youth living on the street, in a car, tent or abandoned building or some other form of shelter not designed as a permanent home; living in a community shelter facility; or living with non-nuclear family members or friends who may not have legal guardianship over

the child or youth of school age. The district shall make available to the homeless child or youth all services and assistance including, but not limited to, compensatory education, special education, English as a second language, vocational courses or programs, programs for the gifted and talented, health services, and food and nutrition programs, on the same basis of those services and assistance provided to resident pupils.
